Bismarck Veterans Memorial Public Library presents:
Americans and the Holocaust Program: The Mission of Herman Stern

WHAT:

During a very dark moment in world history, Herman Stern made a historical decision to aid over 125 Jews fleeing Nazi Germany. This act is a unique and compelling story of a North Dakota citizen who left his mark on the world. It is a study of history, ethics, character, leadership, and citizenship. The program will include viewing the 32-minute film ***The Mission of Herman Stern: The Rescue of Many... An Army of One***. The film's Director and Producer, Art Phillips, and Carl Oberholtzer, History Scholar, and Producer, will lead a discussion following the viewing.

Bismarck Veterans Memorial Public Library is one of 50 U.S. libraries, and the only library in North Dakota selected to host ***Americans and the Holocaust***. This traveling exhibition from the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum examines the motives, pressures, and fears that shaped Americans' responses to Nazism, war, and genocide in Europe during the 1930s and 1940s.
